

SPSA continues to receive very few calls relating to odor issues on Nansemond Parkway.

Currently the following activities continue:

1. The landfill has not received any municipal solid waste since May 1, 2010. Only construction and demolition debris, soils and the like have been deposited at the landfill (inert types of materials).

2. In April approximately 50,000 tons of all types of waste were placed in the landfill. Beginning on May 1st only 9,000 tons were placed in the landfill during the course of May. This is due to a new contractual agreement with Wheelabrator Industries who recently bought the SPSA waste to energy facilities in Portsmouth and who now transport all SPSA non processable (can't be burned) waste to either Big Bethel or Waverly landfills.

3. The "working face" of the landfill is being kept very small so other cover material is not disturbed. This means less surface area is exposed to the potential of landfill gas escaping into the atmosphere.

4. Water being used to wet down the roads at the landfill is being mixed with an odor neutralizer and applied at least daily.

5. Cover material continues to be used instead of a thin posi-shell mixture or other approved daily cover material which is permitted.

6. SPSA has added additional cover to the remainder of the "field" in Cells VI to further ensure that we do not have gas escaping. This was also done because if SPSA is not planning to work in an area for an extended period of time SPSA needs to add intermediate cover.
